At the end of pool play, determine your ranking within your pool using the seeding criteria in the Rules document. Winner of the last pool game, please phone me (799-9550) with the scores from your pool (umpires are recording scores).


All 24 teams go to the playoff. Your entry into the playoff bracket is determined by your ranking within your pool. Use the seeding criteria (see the Rules) to order the teams 1, 2, 3 and 4 within your pool. (So A#4 means the fourth-place team in the A pool after pool games are played.) In the first round of the playoff, the fourth-place teams in each pool move to a nearby field (as shown) to play the third-place team from that field's pool. (Example: the fourth-place team from the Armstrong 1 pool, A#4, moves to Armstrong 2 to play the third-place team, B#3, from the Armstrong 2 pool. The fourth-place team in the B pool, B#4, moves to Armstrong 1 to play A#3.) The first round of the elimination matches up all of the third and fourth place teams. As soon as you know you are in third or fourth place in your pool, go to (or stay at) the correct field so you are ready to play at 2:30.

In the second round of the playoff, the second-place pool teams play the winners from the first round as shown in the bracket. Like last year, the slot at which those second-place teams enter the playoff is determined in advance rather than by a seeding procedure. Second-place teams, go to your assigned field immediately since you need to provide a base ump for the game before yours.

The third round matches the first-place pool teams against the winners from the second round. From there on, it's standard single elimination. Preference for the paths that include a bye went to the teams that made the final rounds last year. (Of course, those teams need to win their pool to win the bye.)

Teams are asked to supply base umpires during the playoff as follows: For the 2:30 and 3:30 games, the team scheduled to play the next game on the field is responsible to supply a base umpire. (For example, team F#2 umpires the 2:30 game at Armstrong 1. Team D#1 umpires the 3:30 game at GovStb.) For the 4:30 and 5:30/5:45/6:00 games, the loser of the previous game is asked to supply an umpire. The tournament will supply two umpires for the last two games.
